Reception

As part of WOW week on Monday 2nd November 2020 we are having a nursery rhyme themed fancy dress day to celebrate the learning we have done around nursery rhymes over the last 7 weeks.

During the day the children will be putting on performances of their favourite nursery rhymes and the nursery rhymes they are dressed up as to each other in small groups, so it will be best if your child is dressed as a character from a nursery rhyme that they are familiar with.
